

# Important tips for iPhone users

Backing up your iPhone before coming into PTCI for any kind of exchange allows you to have a copy of your important information, pictures, and videos. You can back up your iPhone through either iCloud or iTunes.

#### How to back up your iPhone with iCloud

- Go to settings, tap your name, and tap iCloud.
- Turn on iCloud Backup, then tap Back Up Now.
- Stay connected to WiFi until the process completes.

#### How to back up your iPhone with iTunes on PC

- Open iTunes on your computer.
- Follow the on-screen steps, then select your phone when it appears in iTunes.
- Click Back Up Now and wait for the process to finish.

Please back up your phone before coming to PTCI. Our policy is to not back up phones belonging to customers.

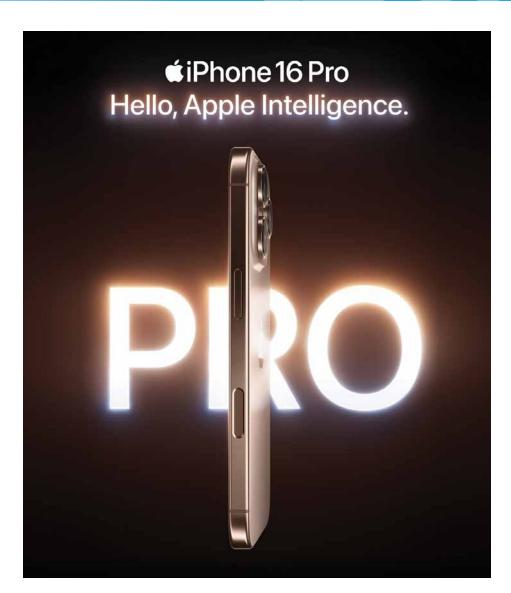

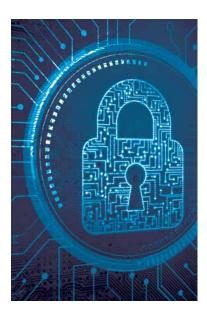
#### October is National Cubersecuritu Awareness Month

**National Cybersecurity Awareness** Month spotlights cybersecurity as a shared responsibility that affects all Americans. It's a collaborative effort between the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and its public and private partners, including the National Cyber Security Alliance. The goal is to raise awareness about the importance of cybersecurity to help individuals stay safe and secure online.

As threats to technology and confidential data become more common, it's important to take steps to reduce your chances of being affected. Here's what the Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency recommends:

- · Turn on Multifactor Authentication -This makes it significantly less likely your accounts will get hacked.
- Update Your Software It's best to turn on automatic updates.
- Think Before You Click More than 90% of successful cyber-attacks start with a phishing email.
- Use Strong Passwords A password manager allows you to generate and store unique passwords.

PTCI encourages you to focus on cybersecurity not just in October, but all year long.

The PTCI WiFi App is a free app that works with our Whole Home WiFi. It gives Whole Home WiFi users the power to control every part of their home network from their phone. Features of the app include security alerts, parental controls, content filters, device prioritization, network monitoring, speed tests, the ability to set up a quest network, change your WiFi password, and more.

## **Understanding CPNI rules**

Customer proprietary network information (CPNI) is the data collected by PTCI and other telecommunication companies about a consumer's telephone calls. It includes the time, date, duration and destination number of each call, the type of network a consumer subscribes to, and any other information that appears on the consumer's telephone bill.

Telemarketers or customer service agents working on behalf of telephone companies must go through an additional customer authentication layer and ask for the customer's consent before accessing the billing information or before using or sharing that information for any purpose, including but not limited to offering an upsell or any change of services. Usually, this takes place at the beginning of a call from the telemarketer to the telephone subscriber.

The U.S. Telecommunications Act of 1996 granted the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) authority to regulate how CPNI can be used and to enforce related consumer information privacy provisions. The 2007 FCC CPNI Order rules further restricted CPNI use and created new notification and reporting requirements.
